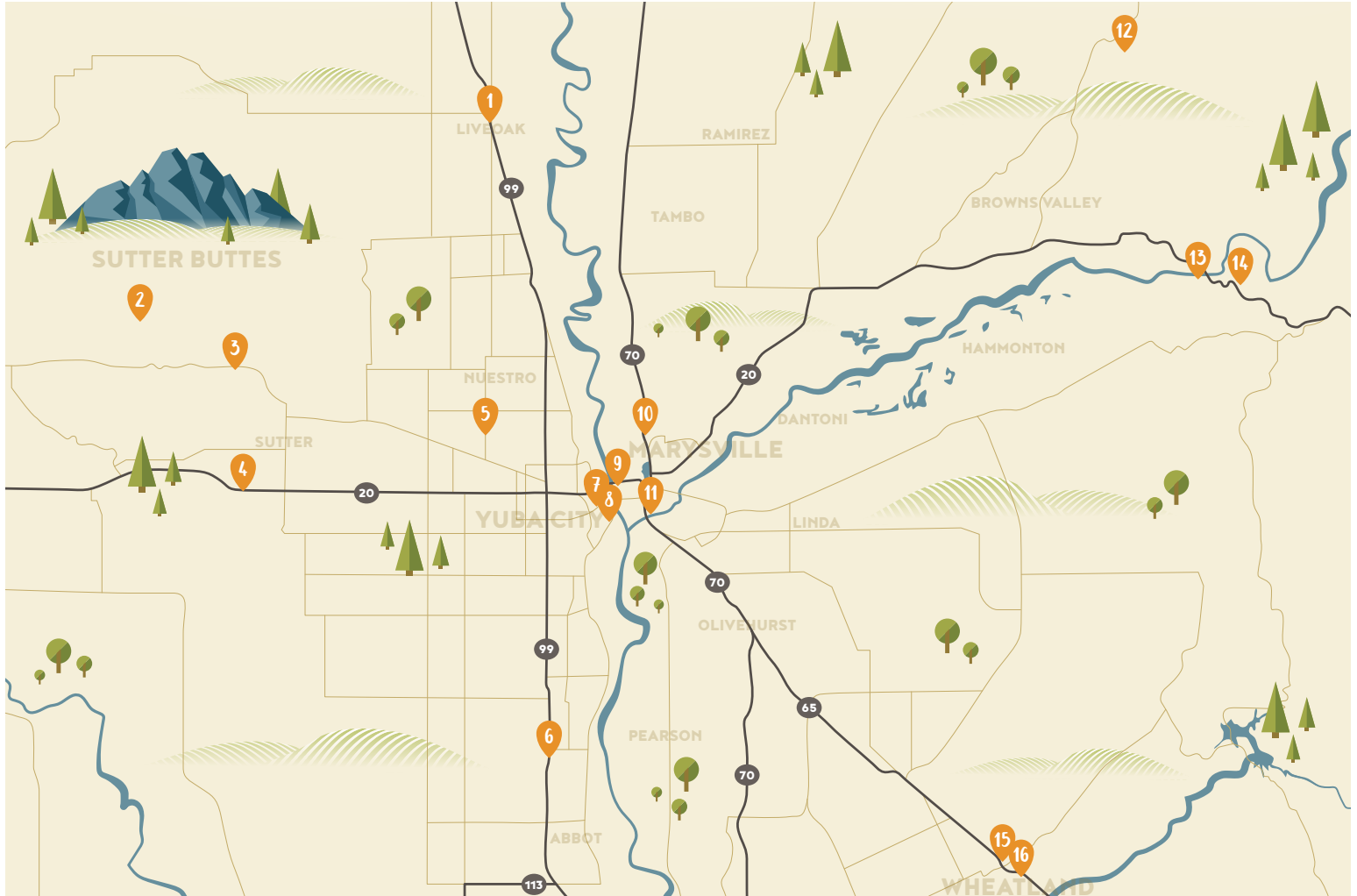




HISTORIC LANDMARKS SCAVENGER HUNT



1 BICENTENNIAL LIVING WITNESS TREE

9922 Live Oak Blvd, Live Oak, CA 95953
This Valley Oak Tree is over 200 years old and stood at the time of the signing of the U.S. Constitution.

2 THE SUTTER BUTTES

Pass Road, Sutter, CA 95982
The World's Smallest Mountain Range.

3 FREMONT HISTORIC MARKER

Pass Rd approx. 1.5 miles west of Butte House Rd
This marker is named after John Fremont who established a major camp in this spot to help the US secure California.

4 PROPAGATION OF THE SEEDLESS THOMPSON GRAPE

Colusa Hwy (.5 mile east of Wyncoop Rd.), Yuba City, CA 95993
Site of Propagation of the Thompson Seedless Grape by Englishman William Thompson in 1875.

5 SIKH TEMPLES

2468 Tierra Buena Rd, Yuba City, CA 95993
This temple was built in the exact architecture of the Sikh temples in India.

6 SUTTER'S HOCK FARM

5320 Garden Hwy, Yuba City, California
California's first organized agricultural endeavor, started by John Sutter.

7 SECOND STREET, YUBA CITY

2nd St, Yuba City, CA 95991
Yuba City's Second Street has a variety of architectural styles of homes along Second from Bridge Street to Garden Highway on B & C Streets.

8 MASONIC TEMPLE

501 Second St, Yuba City, CA 95991
The Masonic Temple was termed the "finest building of its kind in the state" when construction was completed in 1910.

9 BECKWORTH RIVERFRONT PARK

1010 Biz Johnson Dr, Marysville, CA 95901
This park is named after James Beckwourth, an emancipated slave who discovered the lowest elevation pass through the Sierra Nevadas, leading the first wagon train into Marysville in 1851.

10 MARYSVILLE CEMETERY

2144 B Street (Hwy 70), Marysville, CA 95901
The historic Marysville City Cemetery was established in 1850 and is reputed to be the oldest city-owned cemetery west of the Mississippi River.

11 BOK KAI TEMPLE

1st St & D St, Marysville, CA 95901
This Temple was constructed in the early 1850s by a significant population of Chinese immigrants who had fled the troubled Canton province in China.

12 ROBBER'S ROCK

Marysville Rd between Browns Valley and Collins Lake
Infamous outlaw Black Bart hid behind this rock to rob stagecoaches in the 1870s.

13 YUBA GOLDFIELDS

Lower Yuba River approx. 10 miles east of Marysville
More gold has been taken from this watershed than any other river in the United States.

14 SMARTSVILLE & TIMBUCTOO

State Route 20, Smartsville, CA
Two historic goldrush towns that remain intact to this day. In 1855, Timbuctoo was the largest of Yuba County's mining towns.

15 JOHNSON'S RANCH

Front Street Between Fourth and Main Streets, Wheatland, CA 95692
The first settlement reached in California by emigrant trains using the Emigrant (Donner) Trail, an original part of the 1844 Don Pablo Gutierrez land grant.

16 WHEATLAND HOP RIOT

Intersection of A St and 6th St, Wheatland, CA 95692
Site of one of the most important and well known events in California labor history, paving the way for better working conditions and labor legislation.
